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## Editorial.

NO apology, we are sure, is needed for calling the attention of our readers to the ever increasing prosperity of the School and the very satisfactory number of boys on the roll. This term no less than 27 new boys have entered the School, bringing the total up to 93, and the number of boarders to 36.

Unfortunately the School buildings are not elastic, and have not increased in size to accommodate our increased numbers; the consequence being that teaching is carried on under difficulties. We sincerely hope the additional funds required to satisfy the Board of Education requirements will soon be forthcoming, in order that buildings may be erected, which will enable the work to be carried on under pleasanter circumstances and ensure that our boys shall receive their education under the best conditions possible.

The results obtained in the last Cambridge Local Examinations were satisfactory in the highest degree. Although all the boys of the 4th, 5th and 6th Forms were entered for the various examinations, with the exception of those who were doing special work, there were no failures whatever. We congratulate those who have worked so well and produced such a record result.

We are sure our friends will be interested to know that the Lord Bishop of Salisbury has kindly promised to distribute the prizes on December 5th. The distribution will take place at the School, in the afternoon at 3 o'clock. We expect a large gathering, as His Lordship's remarks are sure to be most interesting.

When stating the number of new boys we omitted to mention one, the youngest of all, whose arrival aroused a far greater amount of interest than is usually the case with new boys. We refer to Gordon Charles Tovey, the newly-arrived son of our popular Head Master; we offer him and Mrs. Tovey our hearty congratulations. The boys of the School thought such an important event called for special notice, and presented the "new boy" with a christening present in the form of a beautiful silver salver bearing his initials, surrounded by the words "From the Boys of the Shaftesbury Grammar School." At present Gordon Charles does not show a large amount of interest in his gift, but seems to prefer something in the way of liquid refreshment. However, we may report that he is making excellent progress.

The Swimming Baths proved a great source of enjoyment during the summer, and the majority of the boys who attended them learnt to swim. At the end of the season there were some interesting races for beginners. Prizes were awarded by Dr. Tovey, and won by L. G. Prideaux (over 14) and L. H. Hendon (under 14). Sergt. Milner attended to instruct the boys in the art of swimming, while Mr. Ramshaw frequently gave the learners useful hints, which were greatly appreciated.

## Cricket.

THE team of 1912 was not expected to rival the doings of the unbeaten one of the previous season, and such proved to be the case. We had lost our four best cricketers, and although there was plenty of promising material it was inexperienced. The weather, too, was very trying for a young team; the first month we had a succession of fast wickets, and then for the rest of the term a series of "mud-heaps" on which our small batsmen found it very difficult to get the ball away, so that scoring nearly always ruled low. Still, even this may prove to have been a blessing in disguise, as most of our batsmen learnt to play "back," and will probably reap the benefit of their experience another year. All things considered the team did well, and if the batting averages are not high, there is plenty of cricket in the School which will make itself felt another season. The fixture card was very similar to last year's, except that the Masters played Iwerne Minster C.C. instead of Shroton, and the Boys, Parkstone School instead of Blandford.

Of the batting, little remains to be said; Hall proved himself the most consistent bat on the side, and takes the "average bat." L. G. Prideaux, E. Scammell, F. C. Blucke and W. Jeffery at times displayed promising form, but F. G. Minchin hardly bore out the promise of last season except in one match, when he hit brilliantly and scored the only century made by a boy during the term.

The team was short of bowling, but T. L. Jones and F. G. Minchin managed, as a rule, to get sides out cheaply, and E. Scammell proved useful on occasions. The best feature of the season was the bowling of the two first named, and we shall find it difficult to replace them next year. Jones is undoubtedly the more skilful performer, and the better the batsmen opposed to him the better he bowled; Minchin was at his best in School matches, and Jones in Club matches. Jones wins the bowling prize for 1912. Hall sometimes got wickets, but Jeffery's lobbs proved expensive, and it is only fair to add that he suffered once or twice from dropped catches.

The fielding throughout the term was good, and was favourably commented on by several of our opponents. Scammell once more wins the fielding prize; his ground fielding and return were excellent, and he made several

good catches. F. Minchin made some splendid country catches, and Hall proved himself the possessor of a very safe pair of hands. F. H. Hortor kept wicket very creditably.

In Club matches Dr. Tovey and Mr. Minchin made several good scores. The brunt of the bowling was borne by Jones, who did some splendid performances, notably against Tisbury, when he took the first nine wickets that fell for seven runs! Dr. Tovey and F. Minchin sometimes met with success, but we badly needed a good slow bowler.

The surprise of the season was the form of the "Under 14" XI. Only two of last year's team were eligible, and a great deal of the available material was very raw. But as the season advanced they improved out of all knowledge and won three of their four matches. C. H. M. Platt, the captain, set a splendid example in the field, and the whole side worked hard all the term. G. Hemingway, J. Digby, C. H. M. Platt, R. H. Baker and J. Kilpatrick all show signs of batting ability, and the last named is a most promising bowler; against the Choristers School, Salisbury, he took all ten wickets for 20 runs. The other bowlers were only moderate. Mr. Minchin gave up nearly all his spare time to coaching the second club, and their great all-round improvement was largely due to his untiring efforts.

In conclusion we must thank F. G. Minchin for the hard work he did for our cricket. If his team was not as successful as those captained by his brother, he has the satisfaction of knowing that they all did their best and thoroughly enjoyed their cricket season in spite of the atrocious weather.

#### DETAILS OF MATCHES.

*S.G.S. v. Sexey's School, Bruton*—May 11th, home, won.—

We opened the season by a visit to Bruton. Sexey's won the toss and elected to bat first. Two wickets fell quickly to the bowling of F. G. Minchin, but thanks to an excellent display of batting by Allen (37), Sexey's obtained the useful total of 105. Contrary to anticipation, T. L. Jones was ineffective with the ball, and on the other hand F. G. Minchin bowled with excellent results, securing 8 wickets for 35 runs. Our ground fielding appeared very weak, but the catching was



somewhat better—G. Genge took an excellent one at mid-off. School opened well, Scammell's cutting being quite a feature. Prideaux carried his bat through the innings for 56, obtained chiefly through good forward play. It proved a very useful innings, though not entirely free from "lives." Riddey played a careful and patient game for 20. Another good feature of the game was the running between the wickets.

*S.G.S. v. Old Shastonians*—May 22nd, home, *won*.—The Old Boys got together a representative team under the leadership of R. B. Minchin. Their innings opened disastrously, for two wickets fell without a run being made. R. B. Minchin (13), W. H. B. Morgan (14) and L. F. Spinney (12) were the best scorers in a total of 47. It was essentially a bowlers' day, and was so wet that the start was delayed for a considerable time. T. Jones and F. Minchin bowled well for School, the former taking 5 wickets for 23 runs, and the latter 4 for 23. G. Genge took a good catch at mid-off. School found the same difficulty with the bowling, and F. Buckland and L. Spinney were very effective, the former taking 8 wickets (7 clean bowled) for just over 20 runs. The closing stages were very exciting, as only 5 runs were wanted to win when the last man came in. Genge, however, managed to snick three 2's in succession through the slips, and made the result safe. School played without Masters.

*S.G.S. v. Stour*—May 25th, home, *won*.—School won the toss, and opened well with Dr. Tovey and Mr. Minchin. The former gave an excellent display, full of good strokes, and remained at the wicket until he had secured 123 runs, including 14 fours. School "declared" when 205 runs appeared on the board for 5 wickets. This proved eventually to be our highest score for the season. Stour replied with 120 runs, chiefly through C. Barnes (56). T. Jones was the most successful bowler for School, taking 6 wickets for 50 runs. Some good catches were made, one especially by H. T. Hall in the "country."

*S.G.S. v. Gillingham Grammar School*—May 29th, home, *drawn*.—Gillingham won the toss and runs came fairly fast on a good scoring wicket. Kiddle hit well for 59, including 8 fours. Woodford (27) and Cleary (34) ably seconded his lead. F. G. Minchin made two excellent

catches—one in the long field and the other “c and b.” Taken all round the School fielding was weak, often wanting in cleanness and briskness. Scammell was effective with the ball towards the end of the innings, and obtained 3 wickets in 4 balls. School started batting badly, Prideaux being run out, and Scammell falling into the “leg trap.” Hortor looked like staying, but played on. Riddey fell first ball, and F. Minchin got in front of a straight one. Half the side was out for 46 runs. The advent of H. Hall produced a great change, for, helped by Blucke and then by W. Jeffery, he played out time for a well and patiently-made 50. Thus on the drawing of stumps it was anybody’s game. Coward and Cleary bowled well for Gillingham, the former keeping up a fast pace for a very long time without appearing to tire.

*S.G.S. v. Gillingham Town*—June 1st, home, *drawn*.—Rain delayed the start, and interrupted the game occasionally. E. B. Down was the most successful with the bat for Gillingham, securing 42 runs without losing his wicket. The closure was applied at 132 for 8 wickets. Dr. Tovey, for School, obtained 4 wickets for 37, and Scammell 2 for 15. R. B. Minchin took a good catch at extra cover. With only an hour to bat, and a bad light, School had no chance of winning. H. Hall (26 not out) and Mr. Ramshaw (19) were the best scorers. Hortor appeared to be settling down to run-getting when stumps were drawn.

*S.G.S. v. Tisbury Town*—June 5th, away, *lost*.—School opened on a difficult wicket, and Dr. Tovey alone successfully faced the bowling; Cobby being very effective on a soft wicket, and securing 7 victims. Tisbury started well, but soon began to find that the wicket was very difficult, and thanks to excellent catching on the part of School they were all out for 70 runs. F. Minchin bowled very effectively, getting 7 wickets for 31. Hall, in the long field, made a magnificent running catch, and Mr. Minchin, J. Riddey, and E. Scammell all secured difficult ones. School batted again, and wickets once more fell rapidly, the score reading 45 for 6 wickets, when stumps were drawn.

*S.G.S. v. Sexey's School, Bruton*—June 8th, home, *lost*.—Sexey's School had the first innings, and chiefly through their Captain (32) scored 76 runs. There was a very

weak "tail" which fell easily to Scammell's slow leg-breaks; his analysis read 4 wickets for 14 runs, while H. Hall secured 3 wickets for 10 runs. School did not start well, and wickets continued to fall quickly. When we needed 12 to win over-eagerness cost Scammell his wicket, and then the remaining three batsmen got themselves out with 6 runs still wanting. School fielding and batting were both on the weak side, and two got in front of straight balls. This was our first School defeat for at least two seasons. Congratulations to our victors!

*S.G.S. v. Foster's School, Sherborne*—June 15th, home, *drawn*.—A very wet day; rain delayed the start until after tea. School started with Prideaux and Blucke, and they remained together batting in good style until 79 runs were registered. School "declared" at 102 for 5 wickets, and just after Foster's had started batting rain again fell heavily and stumps were drawn.

*S.G.S. v. Parkstone School*—June 19th, home, *lost*.—This was our first meeting with this School, and much speculation was rife as to what the result would be, for our opponents had carried all before them for two seasons. Parkstone won the toss and put us in. School, however, could make no stand against Norrish, who was quite a "class" bowler. The wicket was very slow and difficult to score on. Scammell (16) was the only player on our side who could do anything. Norrish claimed 7 victims. The Parkstone fielding was very keen and quite a treat to watch. Thanks chiefly to their bowler Norrish—who batted very well indeed for 37 runs—Parkstone's total reached 74. F. G. Minchin was our best bowler, securing 7 wickets for 24 runs. In a second innings School fared worse, and could only obtain 46 runs (W. Jeffery 20), Norrish again being successful with the ball.

*S.G.S. v. Gillingham Town*—June 22nd, home, *won*.—By agreement this was made "12-a-side." School opened with Dr. Tovey and Mr. Minchin; the latter, however, proved to be the only one on our side who faced the bowling successfully. He played very patiently until the tea-interval, and afterwards began hitting very vigorously, obtaining 22 runs in one-over. School "declared" at 151 runs for 8 wickets. Gillingham started very badly, for Jones was bowling on the top of

his form; 6 wickets were soon down for 19 runs. Mr. Brown, who came in first, was the only man to score, and was last out for a capitally played 33. Dr. Tovey bowled well and kept the runs down, securing 4 victims for 23 runs. Jones obtained 6 for the same total.

*S.G.S. v. Tisbury*—June 26th, home, *won.*—School lost the toss, and Tisbury found it impossible to face the bowling of T. Jones, who obtained the remarkable analysis of 9 wickets for 7 runs. Two successive overs were productive of 5 wickets for 1 run. At one period only 11 runs were on the board for 8 wickets fallen. By vigorous attack on the part of Mr. Minchin (44), Mr. Ramshaw (24) and F. Blucke (22), School obtained 118 runs. The first mentioned obtained two good "country" catches. On going in a second time Tisbury produced something more like their real form, and knocked up 125 just before stumps were drawn.

*S.G.S. v. Foster's School, Sherborne*—June 29th, away, *won.*—School batted first and runs appeared to be coming freely, when both Prideaux and Blucke managed to get in front of straight balls. Scammell started well, but was caught; and then followed the stand of the day, F. Minchin and H. Hall defying all changes of bowling. The former by vigorous and forceful hitting obtained 101 (not out), of which over 90 were actually run; his score included one 6 and three 5's all run, six 4's, and nine 3's. H. Hall (43 not out) was contented to score off the loose ones only. Rain interrupted play for a time. School declared at 197 for 3 wickets. Foster's could not play the bowling of F. Minchin (5 wickets for 9 runs) and T. Jones (4 for 38), though Dunford looked in a scoring vein until dismissed by an excellent catch on the part of W. Jeffery. G. Genge, T. Jones, and H. G. Pratt all fielded well. Foster's "followed on" and obtained 15 for 3 wickets—Scammell bowling well (3 wickets for 5 runs).

*S.G.S. v. Gillingham Grammar School*—July 4th, away, *won.*—Gillingham won the toss and put us in on a very soft wicket. Blucke and Prideaux played very carefully and runs came very slowly. F. G. Minchin (19) hit out vigorously, but did not stay long. Blucke faced the fast bowling of Pickford courageously, eventually tiring him out, and was caught after an extremely useful innings of 22, which proved invaluable to his side.

Gillingham fielded very well. School started bowling in good style, and the early batsmen could not do much except Cleary (20) and Biss (15). The game, however, in its later stages got very exciting, for Gillingham crept up closer and closer to our score, and when they needed 10 runs to win with 3 wickets to fall, it looked as if we were beaten. However, Jones rose to the occasion, and the last wicket fell when two runs were wanted to draw. F. Minchin (6 for 31) and T. Jones (4 for 37) were our bowlers. An excellently fought game on both sides, in which no chances were thrown away.

*S.G.S. v. Wimborne Grammar School*—July 6th, home, *won*.—Our opponents batted first and were dismissed for 82, chiefly through T. Jones, who secured 7 wickets at a cost of 36 runs. Turner, for Wimborne, batted successfully, and though he went in first wicket, carried his bat out for 40 runs. School fielding was good. We opened our innings badly, the first three batsmen being caught by misplaying "full pitches to leg." Half the side was out for 20 runs. Then H. Hall (31) and W. Jeffery (22 not out) made a good stand, and runs came freely. This was no doubt in a great measure due to rain coming on at this stage. G. Genge joined Jeffery, and by excellent forcing tactics they made the game ours. They both played good cricket, and showed that they possessed strong run-getting strokes. School scored 91 for 6 wickets.

*S.G.S. v. Shaftesbury Town*—July 10th, away, *lost*.—School started, but with the exception of Dr. Tovey (22) we all found the bowling too good for us, and were dismissed for 51. W. Carpenter and A. Burton shared the bowling honours. Shaftesbury started fairly well, and G. Atkinson, after a "life" in the slips first ball, compiled 29 runs. The rest of the side did not do much with the bowling of T. Jones (5 for 22). Excellent catches were made by Dr. Tovey and F. G. Minchin.

*S.G.S. v. Iwerne Minister*—July 13th, home, *won*.—School opened the innings with Dr. Tovey and Mr. Minchin. The former was the only one on our side to negotiate the ball on the soft wicket with any real success. Rain somewhat delayed play. Iwerne could not very successfully face the bowling of F. G. Minchin, and he obtained 7 wickets for 23 runs. B. Burrows carried his bat through the innings for 19 runs.

*S.G.S. v. Stour*—July 20th, away, *drawn*.—School started on a soft wicket, but collapsed rapidly, with the exception of Mr. Minchin (28 not out). Rain came on, and as there was no prospect of it ceasing, the game was abandoned.

*S.G.S. v. Shaftesbury Town*—July 24th, home, *lost*.—School won the toss. Runs did not come very fast, both Dr. Tovey (10) and Mr. Minchin (12) being caught. Mr. Ramshaw played patiently for 20 runs, and F. G. Minchin (12) and T. Jones (14) were the other scorers. The last-mentioned was badly run out when in a scoring mood. Burton was the most effective bowler. With the exception of H. Wenyon—a visitor—who obtained 64 runs, the Town did not stand up well to T. Jones, and his analysis was 7 wickets for 63 runs.

*S.G.S. v. Dr. Ensor's XI*.—July 25th, home, *lost*.—School won the toss, and Dr. Tovey soon began to score by excellent cricket, showing great restraint, while the rest of the side played only moderately. E. Scammell (17) was the next best run-getter to Dr. Tovey, who was not dismissed until he had obtained 75 runs. D. H. Brown, of Gillingham, was the most successful with the ball, and obtained 6 wickets for 33 runs. Dr. Ensor's XI. began in a weak fashion, and 2 wickets fell for 31. When Dr. Hollick (Sturminster) joined Mr. Buttonshaw (Gillingham) runs came quickly, and the telegraph read 3 for 73. The Rev. R. S. K. Blucke then put on 22 in good style before being c. and b. by Dr. Tovey. Mr. P. S. R. Bridge and the Rev. C. A. Hutchinson made an excellent stand for the eighth wicket, the former compiling 46 and the latter 52 (not out). The last-mentioned player's score was quite a surprise, for we had never previously seen his "attack" so well developed; his score contained some excellent boundary hits and included seven 4's. Our best thanks are due to Dr. Ensor for the excellent game he provided us with.

#### "UNDER 14" MATCHES.

*S.G.S. (Under 14) v. Gillingham Grammar School (Under 14)*—June 29th, away, *won*.—Gillingham batted first, and runs came fairly regularly, Gibson being the best run-getter with 14. C. H. M. Platt and M. Watts were the most successful bowlers, each securing 3 wkts. for 11 runs. School did not open well, and half the

side was out for 24 runs. J. Digby and M. Watts altered this, however, and R. Innocent ably seconded their efforts. Thanks to these players and "Mr. Extras" (14), we managed to prove the victors by 10 runs.

*S.G.S. (Under 14) v. Choristers School, Salisbury*—July 3rd, home, *won*.—The Choristers opened the innings, but were unable to do much with the bowling of J. Kilpatrick, who secured all the 10 wickets for 20 runs. D. Sutton (17) was the best run-getter for Salisbury. - H. T. HALL.—A steady bat with a sound defence and good strokes on the "on" side. Much improved since last season. Fielded very well, and occasionally took wickets.
- L. G. PRIDEAUX.—A very promising bat; has some beautiful forward strokes, but could not get the ball away on wet wickets. A splendid judge of a run. Must improve in the field.
- F. C. BLUCKE.—Improved very much as the season advanced. Has a sound defence and plenty of confidence, but is handicapped by lack of inches. Splendid judge of a run. Very fair field.
- F. H. HORTON.—A most unlucky bat, who could not get going. Has a sound defence and plenty of scoring strokes. Kept wicket very creditably.
- W. JEFFERY.—A very painstaking bat, with a sound defence, but very slow between the wickets. Much improved field. Bowls lobs with occasional success.
- G. O. GENGÉ.—A very keen cricketer, who did not get many opportunities to shine. Has a weak stroke outside his off stump. Good ground field and safe catch.
- J. E. P. STRANGE.—Has a fair defence, but made very few runs in matches. Owed his place in the team to good fielding.

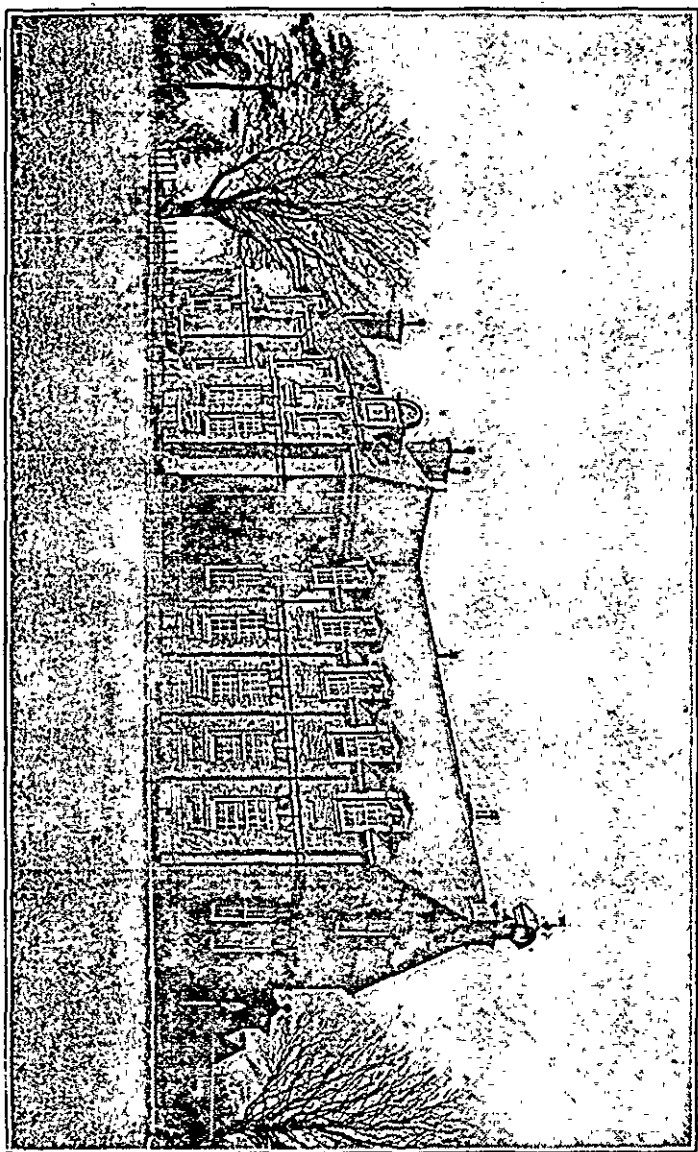
W. R. Atkinson has been moved from the Wilts and Dorset Bank at Glastonbury to the Dorchester Branch.
