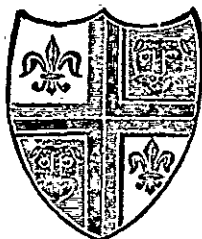

Mr. W. J. Streather, B.Sc., left us at the end of last term, to take a post offered him at Reading School. His place has been taken by Mr. L. P. V. Veale, B.Sc., to whom we extend a very hearty welcome.

Cricket.

AS far as results go, the past season cannot be written down as a very successful one. The Masters' XI., it is true, lost only two of the ten matches played, but the first eleven were beaten on no less than five occasions.

We admit that three colours only remained from last year, and that the opening weeks of the term were too wet for much net practice, but this does not explain the fact that three members of the team who shewed conspicuous promise last year, failed to live up to the expectations we had formed of them. We shudder to think of what would have happened, if Jack Windebank and Dick Hitch had not been with us, and it is to these two cricketers that we owe many of the successes of the past season. A. J. Combes, D. Hoddinott and R. B. Brown never got going, but we still contend that they are potential cricketers.

J. S. Windebank and R. H. Hitch each made a century, in addition to numerous other smaller but equally praiseworthy

scores. It is difficult to say which is the better cricketer. The former, perhaps, is the better all-rounder, and has more style; but the latter watches the ball more closely, and can hit harder when the loose ball comes along.

The bowling was anything but strong, and here, again, we had to rely to a very large extent on the efforts of Windebank and Hitch. The former was the better bowler, for he could always keep a length, while the latter's was somewhat uncertain. A. J. Combes developed into a very useful change bowler, but R. B. Brown, P. Scammell, and E. A. G. Manton have a lot to learn before they can hope to take many wickets.

The fielding of the eleven was too inconsistent to deserve much commendation, but occasionally some very good things were done. J. S. Windebank was easily the best ground field, and a word of praise is due to E. A. G. Manton for his fielding in the slips.

The "A" team was a very poor side, and only met with one success in the five matches played. It contained no player of special merit, and was one of the weakest sides we have had for many years. We have, however, plenty of talent in the lower part of the School, who will doubtless come along next year and remedy this unhappy state of affairs.

The "Under 14" XI. was good, and always worth watching. Two of the three matches played were won easily, and the other one lost only after a tie in the first innings. Several players shewed marked ability, and we are glad to notice one or two very promising young bowlers, who should do well at some future date. The fielding, too, was quite good, while keenness and enjoyment were evident in all their Club games.

The success of the Masters' XI. has already been referred to. We certainly collapsed very badly in our last match against Sherborne, but most teams get an "off day" during a season, and we have generally experienced more than one in the past. A pleasing feature of the season was the help given to the masters by several of the boys, especially Dick Hitch. On several occasions he made runs just when they were badly needed. Dr. Tovey, Mr. Stewart, Mr. Watts and Mr. Minchin all made runs, while Mr. Streather and Mr. Minchin had to do the bulk of the bowling.

May we take this opportunity of saying how sorry we are that Mr. Streather will not be with us next year. We shall miss him very much, for he has been the mainstay of our attack for the last four seasons. We wish him and Mrs. Streather the best of luck in their new surroundings, and sincerely hope they will come and see us when an opportunity arises:

In conclusion, we must thank A. J. Combes, our School captain, for his efforts on behalf of our School cricket. It took him time to learn and put into practice some of the finer details associated with the duties of a captain, but, with the experience he gained this year, he should make a very capable captain next season. The team was not a simple one to manage, because the bowling lacked variety, and the batting order was not at all easy to arrange.

DETAILS OF MATCHES.

S.G.S. (Masters) v. West Hants, home, May 14th, Won.—Our opening match provided us with a victory which was due chiefly to a good partnership between J. S. Windebank (54) and Mr. Minchin (42), who took our score from 18 to 111 for the second wicket. Dr. Tovey (25) and R. H. Hitch (19 not out) also batted well, and our final score reached 182. This proved to be a hundred more than our opponents could muster, Mr. Streather (4 wks. for 25) and Mr. Minchin (5 wks. for 42) being our most successful bowlers.

S.G.S. v. Kilmington & Stourton, home, May 16th, Lost.—School batted first, but gave a very poor performance against some accurate bowling by E. Nicholson (8 wks.), and were dismissed for the small total of 49. Our visitors made anything but a promising start, five of their wickets falling for 10 runs. Their captain, however, came to their assistance with a hard-hit 34 (including 2 sixes), and enabled them to win by 21 runs. Windebank bowled very well, and secured 5 wks. for 28 runs.

S.G.S. v. Fifehead Magdalen, home, May 20th, Lost.—With the exception of Windebank and Combes, School batted very badly, their chief faults being a desire to stop all the straight balls with their legs, and a disinclination to punish the bad ones. Fifehead passed our score before the fall of their sixth wicket, but could only secure a lead of 19. Windebank again bowled well, and secured 6 wickets for 27. Little help, however, was forthcoming from the other end.

S.G.S. (Masters) v. Sherborne, away, May 23rd, Drawn.—An excellent innings by Mr. Stewart (60), backed up by very useful contributions from Dr. Tovey (33 not out) and Mr. Minchin (33), enabled us to reach the respectable total of 177. Sherborne found Mr. Streather's bowling very difficult to score off, and had lost 6 wickets for 78 when stumps were drawn, R. S. Thompson playing a very steady innings of 30 (not out). The fielding, on the whole, was quite good.

S.G.S. (Masters) v. Shroton, home, May 30th, Won.—Shroton batted first against the bowling of Mr. Streather and Mr. Minchin, but soon lost six wickets for 32 runs. A useful partnership then added 50 runs for the seventh wicket, but after this, Windebank dismissed the last four batsmen for 8 runs only. School's score of 108 for 7 wickets was due to some good batting by Dr. Tovey (26), Mr. Watts (20), and R. H. Hitch (34 not out).

S.G.S. (Masters) v. West Hants, away, June 3rd, Lost.—Some very poor batting on our side enabled West Hants to take their revenge for their defeat by us earlier in the season. J. S. Windebank, Mr. Watts and Mr. Minchin alone obtained double figures, the rest of the team being dismissed for 15 runs. When stumps were drawn, West Hants had scored 118 for 7 wickets.

S.G.S. v. Bournemouth Nomads, home, June 6th, Won.—This new addition to our fixture list resulted in a very pleasant game, and we hope that the Nomads will come again next year. The feature of the match was a very good innings of 44 by J. S. Windebank, who went in first. The next six batsmen failed very badly, but the "tail," consisting of E. H. Stickland, R. H. M. Stirling, C. S. Balhatchet and D. Hoddinott, hit out strenuously, and added 70 runs. R. B. Brown (3 wickets for 15) was our most successful bowler.

S.G.S. ("A" team) v. Warminster School, away, Won.—School batted first, but gave a very poor exhibition, Mr. Extras (12) being easily the top scorer. Our total of 38, however, proved just sufficient for victory by the narrow margin of 7 runs, H. G. Young, H. G. Gray, and R. H. Kennedy all securing cheap wickets. No less than four of the opposing batsmen were dismissed when the score board was displaying the unlucky 13.

S.G.S. v. Bournemouth School, away, June 10th, Lost.—The only redeeming feature of this match was the batting of R. H. Hitch and D. N. Hoddinott, the remainder of the team making only seven scoring strokes between them! Hitch's 53 (not out) contained no less than eleven boundary hits, many of them being powerful off-drives through the covers, or well-timed pulls to leg off the short balls. Hoddinott played very steady cricket at a critical time, and made many very nice strokes behind the wicket. J. S. Windebank did not bowl up to his usual form, and none of the other bowlers ever looked like taking wickets.

S.G.S. (Masters) v. South Wilts, away, June 13th, Won.—Dr. Tovey (45) and A. J. Combes (39 not out) were the chief contributors to our score of 170 for 8 wickets. Our scoring had not been very rapid, however, and we did not expect to dismiss our opponents in the short time at our disposal. Mr. Streather bowled extremely well, securing 6 wickets for 29 runs, and Dr. Tovey took 2 wickets for 4 runs just when they were wanted. Their efforts, backed up by some good fielding by the whole team in general, and Mr. Watts in particular, enabled us to win almost on the stroke of time.

S.G.S. v. Shaftesbury Town, home, June 17th, Drawn.—This date was originally fixed for a visit from Bulford Garrison, but unfortunately they were unable to come. The Town team, however, very kindly consented, at short notice, to play the first eleven, and a very enjoyable day's cricket ensued. Shaftesbury batted first, and, thanks to a very good innings of 92 by C. W. Coaker (a member of last year's first eleven), scored 184 runs for 9 wickets. Our reply of 166 for 5 wickets was entirely due to J. S. Windebank, who shewed excellent form in scoring 101 (not out). He batted extremely well, and quite overshadowed the rest of the side. A word of praise is due to the Town "skipper" (Mr. R. Parsons) for very sportingly playing on a few minutes after time in order to let Windebank get his century.

S.G.S. v. Warminster Town, home, June 20th, Won.—Last year Warminster defeated us rather badly, and as we had a weaker side this year, we hardly expected to turn the tables on them. Once more Jack Windebank was the mainstay of his side, taking 5 wickets for 41 runs, and then following up his bowling success by making top score with a nicely-played 44. R. H. Hitch (31), R. B. Brown (22) and R. H. M. Stirling (27 not out), also played well, enabling us to reach the satisfactory total of 182 for 9. Our fielding shewed considerable improvement, Manton, in particular, distinguishing himself by taking three catches in the slips.

S.G.S. ("Under 14" XI.) v. Warminster School, away, June 20th, Won.—Our score of 118—a very considerable one for "colts"—was due to consistent batting throughout the team, though special mention should be made of the batting of D. H. Tovey (31), J. F. Whidborne (20) and H. B. Tuffin (16). Warminster could do very little against Tovey's slow leg-breaks, and could only muster 29 runs, Tovey taking 6 wkts. for 13 runs.

S.G.S. v. Wimborne Grammar School, away, June 27th, Won.—

Another low-scoring match, in which the bowlers held the upper hand. D. N. Hoddinott (18) and E. H. Stickland (17) were the only double-figure contributors to our score of 66, the rest of the team completely failing to master the bowling. Wimborne started their innings in promising fashion, and had scored 31 for 2 wickets when the "rot" set in, the last eight wickets falling for 13 runs only. Windebank (5 wks. for 16) and Scammell (3 wks. for 12) both bowled well, and their efforts were well backed up in the field. Manton again secured three victims in the slips.

S.G.S. ("A" team) v. Milton Abbas School, away, June 29th,

*Lost.—*We batted first, and scored 114 by means of very indifferent cricket. R. F. Preston's 21 was the best innings, but H. G. Young (29) and W. E. Loney (24) also gave considerable help in their own unorthodox rustic styles. Milton Abbas had little difficulty in passing our score, as our bowling was exceptionally weak.

S.G.S. (Masters) v. Bulford Garrison, away, July 1st, Drawn.—

Bulford batted first on a perfect wicket, against the bowling of Mr. Streather and Mr. Minchin, and soon found the former's fast bowling to their liking. The first wicket did not fall until 75 runs were on the board, when Mr. Minchin secured two wickets with successive balls. Runs continued to come quickly, however, and with the score-board reading 200 for 5 wks., Bulford declared. We started disastrously, losing Mr. Stewart's and J. S. Windebank's wickets for one run only. Mr. Minchin (38) and Dr. Tovey (18) then added 60 for the third wicket, and another excellent partnership between R. H. Hitch (52 not out) and Mr. Watts (27), helped by a very useful contribution of 18 (not out) by A. J. Combes, enabled us to score 173 for 6 wickets. Hitch batted exceptionally well, but our fielding was not quite at its best.

S.G.S. v. King Edward's School, Southampton, away, July 4th,

*Drawn.—*With the exception of J. S. Windebank, our bowling in this match was distinctly poor, and the fielding was even poorer. Southampton were therefore enabled to stay in all the afternoon, and to declare their innings closed for 139 for 8 wickets, at the tea interval. Jack Windebank (44) and D. N. Hoddinott (15) gave us a good start, but wickets then fell quickly, and we looked like being out for a hundred. Hitch, Balhatchet and McLachlan then improved matters, but when stumps were drawn we still needed 16 runs to win with two more wickets to fall. Windebank played a great game for his side, but the support he received was very disappointing.

S.G.S. ("Under 14" XI.) v. *Warminster School, home, July 4th, Won.*—Our visitors batted first, but could only score 43 against some accurate bowling by H. B. Tuffin, D. H. Tovey and J. A. Wakefield, the last named taking 3 wickets in one over for 1 run. Our score of 94 was due to a very useful innings by H. B. Tuffin (29), and some assistance from J. F. Whidborne, D. H. Tovey and T. J. M. House.

S.G.S. (*Masters*) v. *Dr. Ensor's XI., home, July 6th, Won.*—The chief feature of our opponents' innings was an excellent score of 82 (not out) by Col. Douglas, who carried his bat through the innings. Mr. Streather (6 for 64) and Mr. Watts (3 for 24) both bowled well. The fielding also reached a high level, especially behind the wicket, where A. J. Combes caught an excellent catch at second slip, and Mr. Watts did wonders in the "gully." Our reply to their total of 185 was the highest of the season, namely, 233 for 6 wickets. Mr. Stewart was top scorer with 71, and with Windebank scored no less than 119 for the first wicket. He hit 14 fours, ten of which were off successive scoring strokes. R. H. Hitch (52 not out), J. S. Windebank (46), and Mr. Watts (35), also played good cricket.

S.G.S. ("Under 14" XI.) v. *Choristers' School, Salisbury, away, July 8th, Lost.*—School batted first and started disastrously, two wickets being down without scoring, and a third with only one run on the board. C. G. F. Hazell and T. M. House then batted steadily and took the score to 54, but our total reached 83 only. Salisbury then went in and scored the same total. Our second innings was not a very clever one, producing a score of 69, which the Choristers were able to exceed for the loss of 3 wickets only.

S.G.S. (*Masters*) v. *Mr. W. G. Tovey's XI., home, July 9th, Won.*—Thanks to good scores by Dr. Tovey (65), Mr. Stewart (58) and Mr. Watts (38), we reached the satisfactory total of 210. A feature of our innings was the wicket-keeping of G. E. Bowley, who never gave away a bye during the whole innings. Mr. Tovey's XI. replied with a score of 178, to which their captain contributed a well-played 60. Mr. Minchin (4 for 52) and Mr. Streather (4 for 61) were our most successful bowlers.

S.G.S. (*Masters*) v. *South Wilts, home, July 11th, Won.*—Good fielding helped Mr. Streather (5 wickets for 27 runs) and Mr. Minchin (4 wickets for 30 runs) to dismiss our visitors for the small total of 66. Dr. Tovey (49) and R. H. Hitch (42) were our chief run-getters, while Mr. Stewart (29) and Mr. Streather (21) rendered yeoman service and enabled our final score to reach the sum of 209.

S.G.S. ("A" team) v. Warminster School, home, July 13th, Lost.—An excellent innings of 88 by C. R. Candy was the chief feature of Warminster's large score of 237, while H. G. Gray shewed himself to be the best bowler outside the 1st XI., by taking six wickets. Our batting, however, was deplorable, N. H. Lock alone showing any signs of run-getting. A description of the remainder's efforts is better left unrecorded.

S.G.S. ("A" team) v. Milton Abbas School, home, July 18th, Lost.—School batted first, but could only muster 46. Blandford made light of their task, and scored 170 for 9 wickets and declared. A second venture by the School produced rather better results, N. Cornthwaite scoring 53 out of a total of 88 for 3 wickets. Altogether an indifferent display by an indifferent team.

S.G.S. v. Bournemouth School, home, July 18th, Drawn.—School's large total of 203 for 7 wickets was almost entirely due to the efforts of Dick Hitch, who, batting at the top of his form, scored his first century for the School. His 105 contained 20 "fours," and was the result of some fine, forceful driving. A. J. Combes (27), D. N. Hoddinott (24) and J. H. McLachlan (22 not out) also played quite well. Bournemouth just managed to escape defeat by scoring 105 for 9 wickets. Jack Windebank bowled splendidly, and had the excellent analysis of 7 wickets for 41 runs.

S.G.S. v. Major Wynne Willson's XI., home, July 22nd, Lost.—A very modest display by the School against some accurate bowling, produced the somewhat meagre total of 94. Our visitors had little trouble in passing this score, and eventually obtained 152.

S.G.S. (Masters) v. Sherborne, home, July 25th, Lost.—A rather heavy defeat brought the Masters' season to a close. This was their only really bad performance during the season, as hitherto they had been beaten on one occasion only. Sherborne, thanks to an excellent century by C. L. Tabor, scored 188 for 5 wickets, and then dismissed us for the paltry sum of 54, Mr. Minchin, Mr. Watts and D. N. Hoddinott alone obtaining double figures.

S.G.S. v. Old Shastonians, home, July 28th, Lost.—This match is chiefly memorable for Dick Hitch's plucky innings, when he was evidently in considerable pain, the result of appendicitis, for which he was operated upon a few hours later. He and A. J. Combes were the chief scorers in a total of 133. The Old Boys entirely owed their victory to an extraordinarily good "knock" by L. W. Toomer, who was not dismissed until he had scored 116.

S.G.S. (2nd XI.) v. Old Shastonians; home, July 28th, Won.— School batted first, and, thanks to a good innings by R. E. J. Richards (39), and useful contributions from E. A. A. Foot (20), D. H. Tovey (18) and A. G. Stehlik (14 not out), made 132 runs. For the Old Boys, W. Doggrell was the most successful bowler, his five wickets costing 35 runs. The Past could not quite reach the Present's total, and were out for 124. R. N. Tayler (37) and W. Doggrell (31) were the highest scorers. In a second innings by the School, D. H. Tovey and N. H. Lock batted well.

CHARACTERS.

[The names are given in the final order of merit.]

A. J. COMBES, *Captain*.—A good batsman when once set, but is a very bad starter. His back play is not yet sound, as he does not watch the ball right on to his bat. Can hit hard, and has a good square cut. Useful change bowler, and a good field.

J. S. WINDEBANK.—A very good all-round cricketer. Took his cricket seriously, and was always trying to improve. Has a good defence; is especially good on the leg side, but has still a slight weakness on his leg stump. Must learn to get well over the ball when cutting. A good School bowler with a good length, but is not very clever at varying his pace. An excellent field, especially in the covers. Safe catch.

R. B. BROWN.—Started the season badly, and then seemed to lose confidence in himself. His stance is somewhat cramped, especially with regard to the position of his left shoulder, but he keeps a very straight bat. Will some day make runs. A fair bowler with rather an uncertain length. Very fair field.

R. H. HITCH.—A very much-improved batsman. Is not a stylist, but he watches the ball very closely, and nearly always scores off a bad ball. Hits very hard, and what is more important, he now hits straight. A very fair bowler, but is too much inclined to bowl "long hops." A fair field with a powerful return.

D. N. HODDINOTT.—Hardly made the progress we anticipated, but shews every promise of making a cricketer. Cuts a ball very nicely, but at present lacks the strength to drive. A very good ground field, but is somewhat slow in his movements.

C. S. BALHATCHET.—Though not a brilliant cricketer, he proved to be a very useful member of the team. Obtained a few runs by somewhat unorthodox cricket, but he is a good field and quite a safe catch. May, some day, make a bowler.

E. A. G. MANTON.—Did not make as many runs as he was worth. Plays forward quite correctly, but is very poor when playing back or when trying to force the game. Fielded extremely well at first slip, where he secured many good catches. Was not quite a success as a lob-bowler, owing partly to the fact that he was not well supported in the field.

R. H. M. STIRLING.—A poor batsman with very little defence. Kept wicket very pluckily, and stopped the fast bowling well, but is not yet a good stumper.

E. H. STICKLAND.—A most uncertain cricketer. Can sometimes make runs, but is very far from being sound. A good ground-field, but not always reliable. Uncertain catch.

J. H. McLACHLAN.—Not by any means a good cricketer, but he could generally be relied on to hit the first half-volley he received. Rather too slow in the field to be really good.

P. SCAMMELL.—A cheerful cricketer who never pretended to bat. Medium slow bowler, who tried very hard to improve. A good field, especially near the wicket.

The Old Shastonian Club Tour.

ONCE again the Old Shastonian Cricket Tour was a complete success. The weather, it is true, was not particularly kind to us, but it failed to damp our enthusiasm or spoil the enjoyment of the tour. One match, that against St. Helens, had to be scratched; another, against Ventnor, was played in a fine drizzle of rain; a third, against Newport, was interrupted by rain and had to be left drawn; for the remaining matches we had fine weather.

An addition to the programme, this year, was a match against the Dudley Wayfarers, who were touring the Island at the same time as ourselves. For this match, the Ryde Cricket Club very kindly lent their ground. This addition brought our programme up to six games. Of the five actually played, we won two and lost two, the remaining one being left drawn.

We left Shaftesbury on Wednesday, July 29th, and made our headquarters at Sandown. Here we had very comfortable hotel accommodation, and also found it very convenient for travelling.

The first match, the day after our arrival, was at Newport. The home side batted first, and we went out to field in a gale of wind. After a bad start (six wickets were down for 75), they eventually declared with 9 wickets down, and left us to get 220 to win. With the score at 80 for 4, however, rain fell in torrents, and after two stoppages the match had to be abandoned.

The next day, Friday, July 31st, we met the Dudley Wayfarers at Ryde. Our batting broke down badly, and although 75 were scored for the loss of only 2 wickets, we were all out for 99, of which R. B. Minchin made 43. These runs the Wayfarers knocked off for the loss of two wickets, and eventually made 214.

Saturday morning was very wet, and although the latter part of the day was beautifully fine, the match against St. Helens had to be scratched.

On Monday, August 1st, on a very "sticky" wicket, we had a most exciting two-innings match against Ryde, which we won, after a thrilling finish, with only one wicket to spare. Set 100 to get to win in just over an hour, we had reached 95

when the last pair—W. Doggrell and L. D. Brett—were together. After a couple of patient overs, every ball of which was watched breathlessly, we still wanted four to win. Then Doggrell suddenly swept one round to the leg boundary, and so won the match.

The match at Ventnor, which we won quite comfortably with several wickets in hand, was notable for some splendid bowling by W. J. Streather under very difficult conditions (the ball was very greasy and the foothold very bad), and some hefty hitting by R. B. Minchin, whose 72 included 3 sixes.

The last match, against Shanklin, on August 5th, we lost by 40 runs. Batting first, we made only 106, and of these, R. B. Minchin made 37, and Dr. Tovey 24. Shanklin started badly—6 wickets were down for 42. A prolonged stand for the seventh wicket, however, enabled them to knock off the runs without further loss.

Once again our thanks are due to our Secretary (R. B. Minchin) for the excellent way in which everything connected with the tour—hotel accommodation, travelling, etc.—was arranged. Everyone agreed that it had been a most enjoyable tour, and that was in no small measure due to his efforts.
