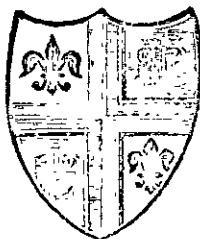

CRICKET.

OF the thirty matches played by the various school elevens, thirteen were won, twelve lost, and five drawn. These results are not quite up to our usual standard, but we refuse to put too much of the blame on the 1927 weather. Wretched as it was, it treated us far more kindly than it did others, and one match only had to be scratched. It is true that practically a new first eleven had to be built up, there being only three old colours remaining from our unbeaten side last year. These three will be the first to admit that their batting performance did not mark them out as being "veterans," though the bulk of the bowling fell to their lot.

The batting was certainly very weak in spite of numerous net practices and exhortations on the two vital necessities of good batmanship, namely, the straight bat and correct position of the feet. Until boys realize these essentials and endeavour to carry them into practice, they will rarely make big scores, and will never make them with that ease and confidence which characterise the true cricketer.

R. B. Brown, R. E. J. Richards and W. J. Dean were perhaps the soundest batsmen, though all had faults which often proved fatal. C. S. Balhatchet and D. H. Tovey played one or two very useful innings, the former in 1st XI. matches, and the latter in Masters' matches, while J. F. Whidborne shewed considerable promise in practice games. The performances of the others left much to be desired, and their places in the team were secured chiefly by their proficiency in the field.

The bowling certainly reached a higher standard, and was consistently good. R. B. Brown and C. S. Balhatchet kept a very good length, but were, unfortunately, about the same pace. With R. M. Law to help them, they had most of the work to do, and did it very well. D. H. Tovey's slow left-arm bowling was often very useful in breaking-up a partnership, but his length is not consistent enough to enable him to bowl a whole side out. C. G. F. Hazell and H. M. Gale were change bowlers, but their bowling lacked length and guile, and did not meet with much success.

The fielding of the eleven was good and was commented on most favourably by opponents and spectators alike. Catches were dropped, of course, and on one or two occasions, dropped rather too frequently, but the team may be justly proud of its work in the field. Some excellent catches were held, but it was the ground fielding which attracted the eye of the critic. C. S. Balhatchet, R. B. Brown, C. G. F. Hazell and D. H. Tovey were really good, while R. E. J. Richards and R. M. Law were

excellent on occasions. Richards caught some good catches in the slips during the earlier part of the season, but missed one or two in the later matches. J. Fancott kept wicket very well, but is a little too slow in his movements to make a really good "stumper." He was very clever in stopping balls on the leg side, and should some day be quite good.

The "A" team were not a good side, and no stretch of imagination could make them one. Their fielding was good, their bowling fair, and their batting weak. No less than nine of them had trials for the first eleven, but only two—J. F. Whidborne and J. G. Hoddinott—obtained places. D. J. Hoddinott, H. J. Shepard, W. G. Welch and G. C. Mitchell shewed some promise, and we hope some of the other members will "come along" next year. J. A. Wakefield, H. J. Shepard, W. E. Thomas and W. H. F. Gauntlett shew promise as bowlers, but H. G. Gray, though considerably faster than the others, never picked up his 1926 form, and could not find his length. The fielding was quite good and several excellent catches were held.

The "Under 14" XI. won all their matches—a very creditable performance. They were, perhaps, stronger in bowling than in batting, and their fielding was very keen—as it ought to be. Although they never made a great number of runs, R. B. Shepard, L. A. T. Dennis, B. Hoddinott, D. Young, and, later in the season, W. Garne, all showed promise. W. H. F. Gauntlett, too, should develop into quite a useful hitter if he will only learn to keep his left elbow and shoulder in a line with the ball. D. Young and W. H. F. Gauntlett did the bulk of the bowling, though R. J. Gray proved himself a very useful change. All three bowled a very fair length; they should practice hard to perfect it, for length is the *sine qua non* of a good bowler.

The Masters' XI. had quite a good season, but again found themselves rather short of bowling. Considering the slowness of the wickets, good scores were made in every match except the one at Bulford. There we fared rather disastrously, though the fielding partly made up for the "scratchiness" of the batting. Dr. Tovey and Mr. Minchin were in excellent form with the bat and were always consistent. Valuable assistance was given by Mr. Stewart, Mr. Veale, R. B. Brown, D. H. Tovey and W. J. Dean. Mr. Minchin obtained two centuries, one against South Wilts in the opening match, and one against Sherborne later in the season.

The bulk of the bowling was done by Dr. Tovey, Mr. Minchin, R. B. Brown and C. S. Balhatchet, while Law met with success on one or two occasions. The fielding, except for

a few missed chances in the country and slips, was very good; Mr. Veale, C. S. Balhatchet, C. G. F. Hazell and R. B. Brown being the most conspicuous. Mr. Stewart was in wonderful form behind the stumps, and has never kept wicket better.

In conclusion, we offer our sincere thanks to Ronald Brown for his efforts on behalf of our school cricket. A very keen follower of the game in all its branches, he soon became a very efficient skipper, and set a good example of keenness to the rest of the side. The mediocrity of the batting at his disposal rather worried him, and possibly prevented him from scoring quite as many runs as he was worth.

We also express our thanks to Dr. Martin and H. M. Gale for taking on the duties of umpires in the Masters' matches, also to R. B. Dashper and his "wire-pullers" for the able way in which they scored our runs!! During the early part of the term the bowling screen was altered, and we are very deeply indebted to Mr. Watmough, A. S. Braddick and L. C. Ryall for providing us with a screen that would do credit to any county ground.

CHARACTERS OF THE ELEVEN.

R. B. BROWN, *Captain*.—A very keen cricketer both on or off the field. Best all-rounder in the team. Very fair bat, but a poor starter. Too much inclined to get out l.b.w., but improved in this respect in later matches. Very good bowler with a much improved length. Excellent field. Made a very capable captain.

C. S. BALHATCHET.—A batsman with a style of his own. Good on the leg side, and has improved his defence. Has just the right temperament for a tight corner, and often made runs when others failed. Quite a good bowler and a brilliant field.

D. H. TOVEY.—A rather disappointing batsman, but when once settled down, can play good cricket. Relies a little too much on the forward stroke, and does not quite get across to "off" balls. Showed considerable improvement as a bowler, but is just a bit too slow to be effective. Very good field with an accurate return.

R. E. J. RICHARDS.—Started the season well, but did not fulfil expectations. Very fair bat, but has one big fault—failure to get across to the ball, with the inevitable consequence of playing inside or being caught behind the wicket. Good slip field. Moderate slow off-break bowler.

- R. M. LAW.—The most improved cricketer in the team. Bowled consistently well throughout the season, but was rather inclined to bowl too short after being hit. Is not yet a batsman, but has developed a "robot" type of defence which may turn to something better. Very fair field.
- W. J. R. DEAN.—Played two very good innings, but was never consistent. Has the style of a good batsman and will make runs some day. Especially good on the leg side, but rather feels for the balls outside his off-stump. Must learn to grow. A rather somnolent fieldman.
- C. G. F. HAZELL.—Hardly the success we anticipated, except in the field, where he more than held his own. Made several very good catches. Poor bat. Must make more definite strokes and cultivate confidence in himself. A moderate change bowler with a tendency to swing from the leg.
- J. F. FANCOTT.—Kept wicket very well. Is not yet quick enough to be a good stumper, but improved towards the end of the season. Disappointing bat, with a lifeless "two-eyed" forward push!
- H. M. GALE.—Not a natural cricketer by any means, but was good enough to make us hope for better things. Disappointing bat, useful field, and a fair change bowler.
- J. F. WHIDBORNE.—Shewed good form in house and practice matches, but never "came off" in school matches. A very useful bat, especially on the leg side. At present is too anxious to score quickly. Slow in the field, but very keen.
- J. G. HODDINOTT.—Came into the team very late in the season and showed some promise. Fair bat at present, but should improve when he has gained experience and confidence. Fair field.
