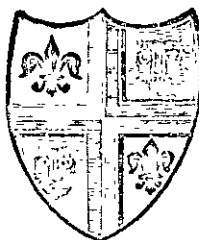

On July 20th, at his home in Sherborne, there passed away, full of years and honour, Mr. George H. Gordon, who for over 20 years had been Chairman of our School Governing Body. To know Mr. Gordon was to love him; his geniality was proverbial, and, added to splendid business qualities, made him an ideal chairman. We can only say here how deeply we regret his loss, and how much we shall miss his valuable help—at all times freely given.

The School was represented at the funeral service in Sherborne Abbey by Mr. R. W. Borley, Rev. N. S. Lawrie and Dr. Tovey.

CRICKET.

THE Season of 1928 was favoured with glorious weather—a distinct contrast to that experienced during the last six seasons. The earlier part of May was a bit cold, but June and July provided ideal cricket weather; the wickets were hard and true, the sun shone, and sweaters were left in the pavilion.

If we had had to criticise the first eleven at half-term we should have said that they were a poor side; but, during the latter part of the season, they improved very rapidly, and, by, scoring 203 for 7 against Major Wynne Willson's XI. and beating Shaftesbury Town and the Old Boys, they certainly redeemed some of their earlier failures.

The weakness of the team lay in its batting. Douglas Tovey made a few very good scores, and when once set was always worth his runs. He would be the first to admit, however, that his defence, especially for the first few overs, was not sound, and it is this unsoundness in the batting which let the team down, especially in the earlier matches.

May we here make a few remarks about the batting, not only of the first club, but of all the clubs? Dr. Tovey, Mr. Minchin and Mr. Stewart spent hours at the nets trying to get boys to adopt the absolute essentials of good batsmanship, namely, the correct positions of the left leg, shoulder and elbow. Now, without these essentials, it is impossible to play with a straight bat, and a straight bat means protection for your wicket and lessens the chances of giving a catch.

Cricket—good cricket—is a scientific game, and we would like to impress on every boy in the School the fact that he must set about his batting in a businesslike way. We have turned out some very good batsmen in the past, and they will be the first to tell you that the above essentials are *not* "old cricketers' talk." Many boys, especially in the middle school, did not set about practising these first principles, and it was heartbreaking to see them waltzing down the pitch to an off ball with their bat at an angle of 45 degrees with the ground. The result was usually disastrous, and the batsmen returned to the pavilion with a very highly exaggerated opinion of the bowler's prowess.

No less than eight boys were tried for the eleventh place in the School team, but only three of them looked like being cricketers of the future. One of them, D. J. Hoddinott, took his cricket very seriously, and by dint of hard practice secured

his colours. In the Old Shastonian match he more than justified his selection, making a very nice 43 and backing it up by holding one of the best country catches we have seen on our ground for many years.

Another disappointing feature of the season was the mediocre form displayed by several of the old colours. W. J. R. Dean, R. M. Law, C. G. F. Hazell and J. G. Hoddinott, all had a poor season when they should have profited extensively from their match experiences last year. It is only fair to add that Law was not in the best of health during the earlier part of the term, and this no doubt affected his bowling.

Having summed up the debit side of our cricket account, we will now turn our attention to the more pleasant business of setting down the assets.

In addition to D. H. Tovey's batting, a word of praise is due to F. D. Hollick and J. Fancott. The former has few scoring strokes at present, but he was always watching the ball carefully, and he kept his position as an opening batsman throughout the season. J. Fancott is an unorthodox bat, but he has the right temperament for a tight corner, and it was mainly due to his efforts that the match at Bournemouth was won. The rest of the batting needs no comment here, although C. G. F. Hazell, W. H. F. T. Gauntlett and H. J. Shepard shewed better form towards the end of the season.

The bowling was certainly stronger than the batting, and in W. H. F. T. Gauntlett we have a good school bowler. He keeps a good length and imparts plenty of spin, and should reap a harvest of wickets in the future. J. A. Wakefield bowled consistently well all through the season, keeping a good length, but owing to his lack of height, his attack lacked "venom." D. H. Tovey, H. J. Shepard, R. M. Law and C. G. F. Hazell took a few wickets, but their length was not sufficiently dependable for any prolonged spell of bowling.

The fielding of the team, on the whole, was distinctly good, and deserves a special word of praise. No side goes through a season without a few dropped catches, and this team proved no exception. Nevertheless, some excellent catches were held, and, with few exceptions, the ground fielding was clean.

In J. Fancott we had an excellent wicket-keeper, whose season's record will compare more than favourably with the majority of his predecessors. Last year he was not a good "stumper," but he has now overcome this weakness, and we have nothing but praise for his season's work in this important position.

In conclusion, we congratulate Douglas Tovey on the very satisfactory and pleasing conclusion to his year's captaincy. His team certainly started very shakily, and the earlier score sheets are sad reading; but he has the satisfaction of knowing that a great improvement was made during the last few weeks. We sincerely hope he will be with us next season. If he is, he will have the services of Fancott and Gauntlett, who, we hope, will form the nucleus around which we can build a better side. We shall want some batting, however, and we look to boys in the middle school to see that we get it. No matter how small and inexperienced a boy is, he must remember that a straight bat is the essential factor of success. Strokes and runs will come in due course, and his cricket will be a pleasure not only to himself, but to opponents and spectators as well.

The Second XI. contained a few promising cricketers, but even they were a little disappointing when they came up against the 1st Club bowlers in the trial games. L. A. T. Dennis, R. B. Shepard, E. J. Southon, D. R. Young and G. C. Mitchell have all got cricket in them, the three first as batsmen and the others as bowlers. The rest lacked defence of any sort, and depended on the long handle for their runs.

G. C. Mitchell, D. R. Young and W. E. Thomas bowled well at times, while J. N. Robertson, F. C. Imber and R. B. Shepard occasionally took a wicket. Lack of length in their bowling was most noticeable, Mitchell being the only one who could be relied on to keep an end going without sending down frequent "long-hops" and "full-pitches."

The best feature was undoubtedly the fielding, which was exceptionally good. Some excellent catches were made, while the picking up and returning reached a high standard. The captain, R. H. Kennedy, always fielded well, and the rest of his team followed his good example.

As far as results go they had a very successful season, winning all four of the matches played.

Though the "Under 14" XI. lost only one match, the side did not quite reach the standard of last year. The fielding—both ground fielding and catching—was good. The bowling was fairly good, but lacked variety; probably W. G. S. Holloway and R. S. Balhatchet were the best, while W. Wakefield bowled quite well at times. The batting, however, was poor. B. Hoddinott and R. S. Balhatchet played correctly, and V. S. Balchin hit lustily on occasions, but taken as a whole the batting was lifeless. The care with which long hops and full tosses were treated was sometimes ludicrous. Long hops and full tosses are fairly

frequent in boys' cricket, and even a boy of diminutive stature ought to be able to score freely from them. With a correct style and a willingness to hit these bad balls, there are lots of runs awaiting the "Under 14" cricketer. The side was well captained by B. Hoddinott, and lacked nothing in keenness.

The Masters' XI. had a very pleasant and enjoyable season, but found half a day too short a time in which to finish the majority of their matches; out of the seven played, no less than three were drawn.

Mr. Minchin, Dr. Tovey, R. B. Brown and D. H. Tovey were responsible for most of the runs, while Mr. Cole and R. B. Brown were the most successful bowlers.

Against Dr. Ensor's XI., Mr. Minchin broke all records for the ground by scoring 202, his second hundred being scored in 40 minutes.

The fielding of the side, except for a few dropped catches, was distinctly good. Valuable help in this respect was given by some of the senior colours, while the wicket-keeping of Mr. Stewart and J. Fancott reached a very high standard.

In conclusion, we extend our grateful thanks to the weather for being so kind to us, and also to R. H. Kennedy for his work as scorer. He put in a lot of time copying out matches for papers and the School Magazine, etc. We also thank those boys who manipulated the score-board, and only regret they were not kept a little more busy during the early part of the season.

In future there will be no order of merit published, and future captains will be elected at the beginning of the season, for both cricket and football.

CHARACTERS OF THE ELEVEN.

D. H. TOVEY, Captain.—If his defence were sounder he would be a very good bat. Cuts and drives well, and is fast between the wickets. Very fair slow break bowler, but almost too slow to be effective for any length of time. Excellent in the field—picks up cleanly and has a good return, as well as a safe pair of hands. Soon developed into a good captain with a sound knowledge of the game.

W. J. R. DEAN.—Did not make as many runs as he did last season. Has few scoring strokes on the off, but is quite good on the leg side. Poor field. Needs more confidence in himself; and should put in a bit more fielding practice in his spare moments.

- R. M. LAW.—Has a very fair defence, but does not seem capable of developing many scoring strokes. Useful bowler, especially with a side wind, but inclined to lose length when hit. Good slip field.
- J. FANCOTT.—A good batsman to force a game, and has more confidence than some members of the team. Would make more runs if he could refrain from playing across a ball. A first rate wicket-keeper. Allowed very few byes, and secured a bag of victims, especially off the slow leg break bowling.
- C. G. F. HAZELL.—Improved very much as a batsman towards the end of the season, but is far from being sound. Has a most unfortunate stroke to a ball on his legs, a stroke which proved fatal on several occasions. Very useful change bowler with a slight swing from leg, but whose length was often at fault. A good ground field and a keen cricketer.
- J. G. HODDINOTT.—Disappointing cricketer of a rather nervous temperament. Has a half forward stroke which he employs on all occasions. Must learn to hit a half-volley. With more confidence should make plenty of runs. Slow in the field, but has some idea of bowling slow off breaks.
- F. D. HOLLICK.—The most improved batsman in the side. Possesses a very sound defence, but few scoring strokes at present. These will come later. Very fair field, and always ready to learn the finer points of the game.
- W. H. F. T. GAUNTLETT.—A very good school-boy bowler. Keeps a good length, and always had other school teams in trouble. A much improved batsman now that he has learned to stand up to the fast bowling. Good field and a safe catch.
- D. J. HODDINOTT.—A good example of what practice and perseverance can accomplish. Started the season shakily, but later was the mainstay of the "A" team. Got his colours late, but immediately justified his selection. Steady bat and fair field.
- H. J. SHEPARD.—Very useful all-round cricketer. Not a sound or a pretty bat, but hits the bad ball hard. Improved very much as a bowler, and is a fair field.
- J. A. WAKEFIELD.—Good medium-paced right-hand bowler. Keeps an excellent length, but is not tall enough to get any help from the pitch. Must try and vary his pace and direction, and be a little more clever in spotting an opponent's weakness. Fair batsman. Moderate field.
