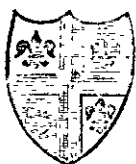

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EDITORIAL.

WE congratulate our Cricket XI. and its Captain on their very successful season; their record stamps them as one of the best sides we have had since the war. The Masters' XI. also deserve our hearty congratulations on going through the season without being defeated.

We offer our sincere thanks to the Rev. H. H. Coley for presenting the House Shield and Cups to the winners during the luncheon interval at the Past v. Present Cricket Matches. The winners were as follows:—House Shield, the Corinthians; Shooting Cup, P. F. Drew; Batting Cup, R. B. Shepard; Bowling Cup, W. H. F. T. Gauntlett; Fielding Cup, W. H. F. T. Gauntlett; Fives Cup, F. D. Hollick. The last-named was unfortunately unable to be present.

We are very pleased to say that our Cadet Corps last term won the Lucas Tooth Shield Competition for 1929-30, and we offer them, also, our hearty congratulations. Owing to the refusal of the Government to recognise Cadet Corps, our Corps will, for the present, have to carry on under different arrangements, which have not yet been definitely settled. We hope, however, that this necessity may be only temporary; we feel that the Government's action in countenancing military drill in some schools and not in others is a most arbitrary and unfair proceeding, and we cannot think that an Englishman's love of fair-play will allow such a state of things to continue for long.

Another Cup has been presented to the School by a donor who prefers to remain anonymous, and it has been decided to call it the "Sportsman's Cup." It will be awarded annually to the best all-round boy at games during the School year, and will be judged on School and House match performances. We feel certain that any boy will consider it an honour to win such a cup, and we offer our grateful thanks to the donor for his (or her) kind gift.

Dr. Tovey has started a School Scholarship Fund to give help to boys of ability who wish to go to a University. No general appeal for funds will be issued, but, needless to say, any contributions will be gratefully received and acknowledged by him.

THE cricket season of 1930 was a very successful one and provided many features by which it will be remembered.

The weather at the beginning and at the end of the term was not all that might be desired, but during June and the earlier part of July it was quite good.

The matches against the Bournemouth Incogniti and Sherborne Town were spoilt by rain, while the O.S. Matches on July 23rd were literally a "wash-out."

1ST ELEVEN.—Of last season's team we had the services of R. S. Balhatchet, L. A. T. Dennis, R. B. Shepard and D. R. Young, while W. H. F. T. Gauntlett, our skipper, returned to us after one season's absence through illness. To these we looked for the nucleus of a good team and we did not look in vain.

The School has been represented by stronger teams, especially from a batting point of view, but there has never been a team which so fully lived up to expectations or, we might truthfully say, exceeded them. A few weeks were spent in settling down and the form displayed in the earlier matches was a bit disappointing. R. B. Shepard then started the ball rolling by scoring two "not out" centuries in successive matches, and the team never lost another match. Shepard may well be proud of his last term at school. In ten completed innings, he scored over five hundred runs and failed to reach double figures on two occasions only.

D. R. Young was also successful with the bat, and invariably made runs when they were needed. R. S. Balhatchet, W. H. F. T. Gauntlett, and L. A. T. Dennis all did well. The first-named still lacks strokes, but has a good defence, while Gauntlett and Dennis often came to the rescue when things were going badly. They each would make many more runs if the l.b.w. rule were abolished.

In W. H. F. T. Gauntlett and D. R. Young, the team possessed two good bowlers, the former a slow left-hand, the latter fast medium right. Gauntlett's 56 wickets at a cost of less than ten runs apiece, was an extremely good performance,

and we sincerely hope he will be with us again next season. The best of the change bowlers was W. G. S. Holloway, but he seemed to bowl very much better on occasions than on others. He bowled exceptionally well in the Southampton match, in which he took 4 wickets for 8 runs, and accomplished the hat-trick.

The fielding of the team was not always good but it improved towards the end of the season. Gauntlett's ground fielding at cover was the best feature. W. E. Thomas was always alert and active, and R. S. Balhatchet held some very good catches in the slips. Dennis is also a very good fieldsmen, but he had to don the gloves and keep wicket. After a moderate start, he improved very greatly and is now a good school wicket-keeper.

In accordance with the wishes of the M.C.C., we gave the larger wickets a trial, and the success of the team leaves us with little cause for complaint.

2ND ELEVEN.—Another very pleasing feature was the success of the second eleven. It was a very much better team than the one of 1929, and contained several players of distinct promise. W. F. Cox, B. G. Gyles, A. P. B. Brown, C. H. J. Galindo, W. Garne and the brothers Wakefield will all make runs some day, and A. E. Mayhew nearly secured a place in the 1st XI.

The bowling was accurate, without being brilliant, but Peter Brown shows promise of becoming a successful slow leg-break bowler. C. H. J. Galindo, W. Wakefield and M. Wakefield were bowlers of the steady type, but they did not always spot the weak points in the opposing batsmen's defence.

The fielding was above the average, and J. L. Lyne distinctly good behind the stumps.

"UNDER 14" XI.—At present the standard of play in the "Under 14" Club is not worthy of us, and we hope for an improvement next season. A. W. Harding was easily the best bat, and there is cricket in A. Crocker, R. E. Hunt, G. R. Cole, R. F. Isgar, F. Austin and W. Russell. The remainder were far too rustic in their methods, and must learn to get some semblance of a defence. The bowling was very weak, and the fielding, with very few exceptions, was bad.

MASTERS' XI.—The Masters had another successful and enjoyable season, and were, perhaps, stronger than they have ever been. Mr. Williams and Mr. Cole bowled splendidly, with the result that our opponents' scores were nearly always within the limits of our batting powers. Mr. Minchin made an

excellent century against the Bournemouth Amateurs, and Dr. Tovey and Mr. Veale scored 81 and 77 respectively against Dr. Ensor's XI. The fielding was good except in two matches, and Mr. Veale and L. A. T. Dennis successfully shared the position of wicket-keeper. They took the fast bowling very well, and allowed very few byes to pass them.

In conclusion we offer our very heartiest congratulations to W. H. F. T. Gauntlett and the 1st eleven on their successful cricket season. Success is not always measured by the number of matches won, but often by the general form displayed and the spirit in which a team fights. All members of the team were keen, and it was a pleasure to be associated with them. Gauntlett knows the game and loves it, and he has the pleasure of knowing that his keenness, backed up as it was by the loyalty and enthusiasm of the senior colours, enabled a moderate eleven in May to become a really first rate eleven in July.

CHARACTERS OF THE ELEVEN

(in alphabetical order).

R. S. BALHATCHET.—Good defensive batsman. He must, however, learn to put more energy into his strokes. Is good on the leg side, but his footwork is too slow and methodical. Very good between the wickets, and knows a short run. Is usually a very good slip field, and caught more catches than any other member of the team.

F. A. CHUBB.—Came into the team late in the season as a moderate "all-rounder." As a slow bowler he keeps a very good length, and is not easy to score from. A good field and a fair batsman.

E. COMBES.—Was the last to obtain his colours. Is still very young, but with practice and experience he should become a good cricketer. Keeps a very straight bat, and has quite a good defence. Is at present much too slow in the field.

L. A. T. DENNIS.—Hardly made the runs we hoped for, but he has a better style than any other member of the team. Possesses the typical left-hander's shot to leg, and can also cut and drive. He still gets his right leg in front of a straight one, and often plays across a ball. Kept wicket very well, especially towards the end of the season. Is also an excellent field.

W. H. F. T. GAUNTLETT, *Captain*.—A much improved batsman, but has the unfortunate habit of putting his left foot in front of a straight ball. Can hit hard, and is invaluable when

things are going badly. Excellent slow left-hand bowler with plenty of spin, and an accurate length. Very good field at cover. Has a clean pick up and a good return. Knows the game very thoroughly, and has made an admirable captain.

B. HODDINOTT.—A keen left-handed cricketer with a good defence, but has little power in his strokes. This is particularly noticeable on the off side, where his drive is little more than a push. Can cut nicely, but is not very good on the leg side. Is a very fair field, and possesses a safe pair of hands.

W. G. S. HOLLOWAY.—At his best, a very good bowler; at his worst, no bowler at all. Has a good action with a high delivery, and can bowl a "swinger." Has improved very much as a batsman, but possesses very little defence. A good ground fieldsman, and usually a safe catch.

R. A. JEEVES.—An unorthodox cricketer with a good eye, but little defence. The absence of the latter was most noticeable on fast wickets and against good bowling. Can hit a long-hop very well, but until he plays with a straight bat he will rarely stay long against a bowler keeping a good length. Somewhat nomadic in the field. Fair change off-break bowler.

R. B. SHEPARD.—Had a wonderfully successful season, and is deserving of the highest praise. He has a good defence, he can hit a half-volley really well, and is a good judge of a short run. His one conspicuous fault is his inability to get across to and over the off ball. Without detracting at all from his fine performances, he certainly had all the luck that was going especially in regard to dropped catches. A good field with a safe pair of hands, and is a very fair change bowler.

W. E. THOMAS.—By no means a natural cricketer, but is a very cheerful one. His batting in practice games and at the nets led us to hope for better results in matches, but his anxiety to score quickly often resulted in his not scoring at all. He is, however, a fine field, always active and alert. Fair left-hand bowler.

D. R. YOUNG.—A much improved cricketer in all branches of the game. Scored runs in nearly every match, and especially when they were wanted. He now stands up to the fast bowling and has more strokes on the off-side. A good school bowler of the fast-medium type, who would be more successful if he bowled a little less straight and varied his pace more. A very fair field with a strong return.
